## **ABSTRACT**

The purpose of this paper is to analyze the importance of the constitutional principles concerning the formation and validity of discretionary administrative acts. It also presents State formation and its role in the creation of its juridical structure, placing the Federal Constitution as the supreme law and as responsible for the organization of the system of rules and principles that will outline the Public Administration acts. These principles are essential in order to guide the administrator towards his public role where the Constitution establishes the basic rules of law to be followed.
